This is not a fair world. India is steadily progressing economically. Despite of India's spectacular economic development, why do millions have to go hungry; live in most unhygienic conditions, without even basic education for their children; or die of diseases we can prevent?

OUR OBJECTIVES

Our main objective is to improve the quality of life of the marginalized people. The level of our success is dependent on our ability to create awareness about the inherent strength we all have for making a concerted effort to build a more equitable society where equal opportunities could be provided to all for living with dignity.

Many hurdles have to be crossed to achieve our objective. The despair of the underprivileged has to be replaced with hope, their fear with security, and their ignorance with knowledge. We are an effective link between the people in need and those who have the ability and resources to help them.

OUR PRESENT ACTIVITIES

1. Free Health Camps for Slums

SRO has organised about 30 free camps at various locations in slums in Delhi & NCR over last few months. We have empanelment of qualified MBBS, MD & Gyne doctors on our rolls. The camps have become very popular. On an average we treat about 60 patients in our camp. They are given free medicines, free consultation & counseling besides discounted diagnostics with various centers.



2. Promotion of Yoga and Meditation:

The organization imparted training in yoga and meditation to the community people at Delhi and Faridabad. We have tied up with Yog Sadhana Ashram, Hoshiyarpur & Punjabi Bagh, New Delhi in spread of free Yoga techniques.

We have volunteered to teach free Yoga to one & all. So far we have trained about 200 people thru our various campuses with the support of local socialists. These programmes were designed to help the inmates develop a healthy personality through meditation. During the sessions, the participants were engaged in various fun-filled meditation based activities to help them overcome negative attitudes and various other mental blocks.



3. Health Camps with Fortise Hospital

Social Reforms Organisation has joined hands with Fortise Hospital by supporting health camps under 'Swathaya' programme. Our volunteers work with Fortis doctors and running successfully mobile camps over last 3 months. The programme extends medical and health care support to poor and needy population residing in slums, JJ clusters and rural areas who cannot afford it otherwise. Under the initiative, a series of health camps would be organized in slum clusters of Delhi and rural areas in Faridabad.

4. Talent Search from Slums

Our volunteer works in slums to search talented children & getting them admitted to Govt. Schools. So we succeeded in sending 30 children to various govt. Schools after talent search. We select needy children who are willing for schooling. We counsel parents of such children & provide them to send their wards for school.

5. SRO Organised Yoga Classes for NTPI (National Power Training Institute), Faridabad

6. SRO Team Organised free Camp on 25th Dec 07

BASIC AMMENITIES OF A TOWN

- Mass Transport system available to every house at walking distance within 500 meters
- Every house should have access to Park within 200 meters
- Adequate plan for water, electricity, sewerage system for next 50 years
- Good road infrastructure for next 50 years
- Safety and security of area and police protection
- Environment Friendly systems like adequate trees, green areas, parks Solar energy electricity generation etc
- Adequate Shopping areas, community center , hospitals ,schools and office complex .
- Advance planning and small township for migratory workers like construction labors, artisans, domestic maids , low paid workers etc. with all facilities like water, electricity, sewerage, day care centre and vocational schools .
- Industrial parks to be on the outskirts of residential areas with good rapid transport system
- Connectivity to national highways within 50 kms

GOVERNMENT REGULARITY IN SETTING UP NEW TOWNS

BASIC AMENITIES OF A TOWN

1 Public conveyance should be easily available to the people of the town. We have witnessed several new towns in recent times, where commuting is a major issue. In such scenarios, it becomes mandatory for all the residents to own a vehicle, which is not a feasible option, and also, increases pollution and fuel consumption drastically—a problem that can be easily resolved by ensuring adequate availability of public transportation at all the strategic points of a town.

2 Parks play an important role in the development of a society, and therefore, should be available within 200 meters of every household. This will ensure that all the children will have a park in their vicinity, and we all are aware how important it is for children to indulge in physical activities. Apart from serving as a playing area for children, a park also provides space for various activities of the adults, such as walking,

chatting with neighbors, and the like. Additionally, a park is also important from the environmental point of view.

3 Water, electricity, and sewerage system are the basic facilities that form the backbone of any modern settlement. Any laxity in either of the three can cause major problems in the day-to-day lives of the people. It is also worth mentioning that water, in this case, signifies adequate arrangement of water for general use and potable water. All these should be planned keeping in mind the growth over the next 50 years at least.

4 Many big cities in India are facing the problem of not having proper infrastructure in terms of roads. The primary reason behind this problem is inadequate planning while constructing the roads. While planning the roads, one needs to take into account of the increase in vehicles and the population of the area for at least coming 50 years.

5 Safety and security of the residents of any town is of utmost importance. This can only be ensured by adequate presence of police personnel and police check-posts at all the strategic locations. The police can further utilize the services of private security personnel to assist them.

6 Conserving the environment is very important in the present world. Every town should also play its role in environment protection by keeping the surroundings green, planting lots of trees, and promoting the use of renewable energy, such as solar energy.

7 A town can only be complete if it answers to all the needs of its residents. Therefore, it must contain all the things that people require in their daily life, such as, community centers, shopping areas, schools, hospitals, to name a few.

8 There should be clearly demarcated areas, or a township, that is for the economically weaker group. But such a township must also have all the basic amenities and other facilities that a human being requires.

9 The industrial area should be ideally on the outskirts of the town, but there should be proper transportation between the industrial area and the town so that the people working in the industrial area do not face problems.

10 In spite of having all the above-mentioned facilities, a town is not an independent unit, rather a part of a larger unit, and therefore should be well connected with other towns and cities, through state and national highways.
